

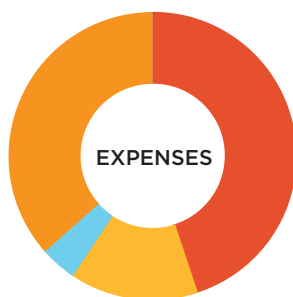

OUR MISSION *To generate a strong, inclusive community through performing arts.*

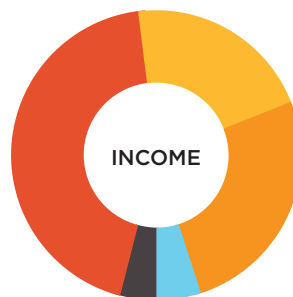
